

Regulations for tuition fees 2021-2022

Status:

- Indexation of the statutory tuition fees is in accordance with the Statistics Netherlands ('CBS') Index. Statutory tuition fee amounts are in accordance with publication in the Government Gazette ('Staatscourant') on 12 June 2020.
- Institutional tuition fees are indexed based on Higher Education wage room developments as reimbursed in government funding.
 Indexation is based on the clarification by the Netherlands Association of Universities of Applied Sciences ('Vereniging Hogescholen') on the wage room developments detailed in the spring memorandum of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science ('OCW').
- Adopted by the Board of Governors on 16 June 2020, under precondition of advice from Student party of the Central Representation Council on policy in respect of institutional tuition fees .
- The Student Party of the Central Representation Council has been informed on 25 June 2020 of the possible legislative amendment Wet Taal en Toegankelijkheid (Law Language and Accessibility) and its possible impact on the institutional tuition fees for EER and non-EER students in 2021-2022.
- Positive advice from the Student Party of the Central Representation Council on policy in respect of institutional tuition fees on 1 July 2020.
- The exceptions 4 and 5 as described in chapter 3 have been clarified on 5 October 2020
- On 13 April 2021, the Board of Governors has decided to meet the request of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science ('OCW') to apply a one-time reduction of 50% to the statutory tuition fees (based on a reduction of € 1.084 for the full statutory tuition fees). The tuition fees of students who owe institutional tuition fees will also be reduced by a maximum of € 1.084. The consequences of these reductions are implemented in the addendum at the end of this document.
- The Student Party of the Central Representation Council has advised positively on a one-time reduction of a maximum of € 1.084 of the institutional tuition fees on 29 April 2021.

1. Context

<u>The Stronger Control Act</u> (Dutch: Wet Versterking Besturing) became effective on 1 September 2010. This relates to the altered legal criteria on the basis of which a student is eligible for the legally-specified tuition fees upon registration for a financed course of studies in higher professional education.

Students who do not meet these criteria owe institutional tuition fees.

Because the Act also determined that educational institutions will no longer receive funding for these students, the Act grants the institution governors some freedom to determine the level of institutional tuition fees. The participation council has prior recommendation authority in respect of decisions on the policy in respect of institutional tuition fees.

In the regulations for tuition fees it was determined that Fontys would charge high rate institutional fees to students who on the basis of statutory criteria are no longer eligible to study at the basic statutory tuition fees rate.

In the 'Nationaal Programma Onderwijs' (NPO), a government programme for the development of education to counter the effects of COVID-19 on education, a measure for a one-time halving of the full statutory tuition fees is included. In the letter 'Nationaal Programma Onderwijs - middelen en verzoek besteding 2021' (ref.nr. 27559271, april 2021), the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science ('OCW') has asked institutions of higher education to apply this reduction of the tuition fees for the academic year 2021-2022 in advance of the talks regarding the implementation of the legislative amendment by the Senate and Parliament, which will be held in May 2021. Fontys has implemented this reduction; this is a **one-time** reduction of 50% of the statutory tuition fees.

Institutions of higher education will be compensated for this reduction by the Ministry. **Fontys will** recharge the full compensation for this reduction to students, in the determination of the tuition fee

amounts. For institutional tuition fees, this means that Fontys has applied a **one-time** reduction of a maximum of \in 1.084, for the academic year 2021-2022.

The tuition fees as included in these regulations are the normal amounts, excluding the reduction resulting from the NPO. Final tuition fee amounts for the academic year 2021-2022, that include the reduction, can be found in the addendum at the end of these regulations.

2. Who is eligible for the statutory tuition fees?

Statutory tuition fees are payable by students who meet the following criteria:

a. Nationality requirement

The student belongs to one of the groups of individuals as intended in article 2.2. of the Student Financing Act 2000 (Dutch: Wet Studiefinanciering 2000) (students with EEA or Swiss nationality) or the student has Surinam nationality;

- AND
- b. Degree not yet obtained

The student registering for an associate degree course has not previously obtained an Associate Degree, Bachelor's Degree or Master's degree.

The student registering for a Bachelor course has not previously obtained a Bachelor's Degree. A student registering for a Master course has not previously obtained a Master's degree. This relates to degrees (or equivalent certificates) from financed Dutch universities or universities of applied sciences since 1991, as entered in the Central Register for Enrolment of Higher Education (CRIHO).

The condition referred to in sub b. does not apply to students following a course of studies in the field of education or health care, for the first time.

The condition referred to in sub b. does not apply to students following an associate degree-, bacheloror master course in the field of education or health care, for the first time.

This means that students who have obtained a degree in a field other than health care and education, may follow a course of studies in one of the fields of health care or education subject to statutory tuition fees only once. The table below indicates which fees will apply for this specific group:

In addition to criteria for statutory tuition fees as referred to above, additional (statutory) regulations apply to the following specific groups:

- Students who have started a second study programme while following a first study programme are permitted to complete this study programme, if uninterrupted, subject to payment of the statutory tuition fees. This regulation was adopted in the Act and became effective per 1 September 2014.
- Students who have completed an initial study programme subject to statutory tuition fees and subsequently, during the same academic year, start a second study programme can study for the remainder of the academic year in question subject to statutory tuition fees. In the next academic year, they will pay institutional tuition fees.

[1] The increase in respect of the previous academic year (2020-2021) is based on price indexing at 1.2%, based on the consumer price index of Statistics Netherlands (CBS).

[2] For part-time courses, a bandwidth has been laid down in law. For 2021-2022, this bandwidth is based on the same indexation and is set between € 1.291,- and € 2.168,-. For the reduced statutory tuition fees, this bandwidth is set between € 645,- and € 1084,-.

[3] With the exception of the part-time study programme Master Choreography, which is offered by Fontys school of Fine and Performing Arts (Hogeschool voor de Kunsten) in cooperation with Codarts University of the Arts (Codarts Rotterdam). For this part-time study programme, the maximum legal bandwidth amount applies (€2.168,-).

[4] For students who enrol for a bachelor- or associate degree programme for the first time from academic year 2018-2019 onward and are eligible for statutory tuition fees, the reduced statutory tuition fees will apply the first year. Students (who are eligible for the reduced statutory tuition fees) who enrol for a study programme in the field of education, are eligible for an additional year of reduced statutory tuition fees.

[5] Students:

- who have started in higher education for the first time in 2018-2019 or later and;
- who enrol for the first time for a master in the field of education from academic year 2021-2022 and;
- who are eligible for statutory fees <u>and;</u>
- who have not yet received an additional year of reduced statutory fees due to enrolment in a master in the field of education,

are entitled to reduced statutory fees during the first year of the master in the field of education.

[1] Transitional arrangement

Starting academic year 2018-2019, the institutional tuition fees for a number of study programmes have been raised. Fontys has a transitional arrangement for students who have started their study programme in or before academic year 2017-2018. They will pay the institutional tuition fees that were applicable according to the tuition fees regulations 2017-2018, increased with a yearly indexation.

Students who have started in or before academic year 2017-2018 are eligible for this transitional arrangement for a maximum of five consecutive academic years. This maximum is calculated from the academic year in which the student started the concerning study programme.

I.e.: For students who started their study programme in academic year 2017-2018, the transitional arrangement expires September 2022; therefore, from academic year 2022-2023 onwards, the increased rate will be charged.

For students who started their study programme in academic year 2016-2017, the transitional arrangement expires September 2021; therefore, from academic year 2021-2022 onwards, the increased rate will be charged.

Etc.

For students who are eligible for the transitional arrangement and who start (switch to) a different study programme, the transitional arrangement ends with immediate effect.

[2] The above rate for the Master course offered by Fontys in collaboration with Codarts Rotterdam will be determined in consultation with Codarts Rotterdam.
